Accelerated Bi-Weekly Mortgage Payments

Do you have a monthly mortgage payment but get paid every 2 weeks?

One of the simplest ways to reduce the total interest you pay is to split your mortgage payment in half and pay that amount every 2 weeks.

You're not likely to notice the extra amount you are paying off but it can make a big difference over the entire mortgage.

Instead of making 12 payments, you would be making 26. The advantage is that it's like paying an extra month directly to the principal every year.

As an example, if you have an \$200,000 mortgage for 25 years @ 5%, you would pay \$148,963 in interest over that time period. By switching to an accelerated bi-weekly mortgage payment you would pay

\$124,095 in interest and will have the mortgage paid off in 22 years.

So in this example, that means by making this small change to your payment you would save almost \$25,000 and be mortgage free 3 years sooner!

Outdoor Water Saving Tips

- ✓ Use automatic timers on sprinklers If you will be leaving during the watering.
- ✓ Purchase a rain barrel to collect rainwater from your roof
 - ✓ Use a drip irrigation system. This system is the most effective because it directs water to the root zone.
 - ✓ Place sprinklers so they are not watering driveways, sidewalks or streets.

The Progressive Conservative Association of Alberta (PCAA) is inviting Albertans to participate in the process of selecting a new leader for the Party and a new Premier for Alberta. Six Candidates are vying for the honour and responsibility of leading Alberta in the future. PCAA has developed an Election process that allows all Albertans to participate in the selection of a new Premier.

Eligible voters shall be:

- (i) Canadian citizens;
- (ii) Of the full age of 16 years;
- (iii) Ordinarily resident in Alberta for at least six (6) months immediately prior to voting date;
- (iv) Members in good standing of a Provincial Progressive Conservative Constituency Association (memberships required are available at the polls)

For voters in the **Dewberry area**, your opportunity to support your preferred Candidate in the voting process will be at polls close to where you live.

First Ballot Voting

Sept.13, 2011 Advance Poll Kitscoty located at the Kitscoty Seniors Centre

Sept.17, 2011 Election Day Poll Dewberry located at the Dewberry Seniors Centre

In the event that one of the Candidates does not receive a majority of votes, a second vote will be held, whereby the three Candidates who received the largest number of votes on the First Ballot, advance to a Second Ballot.

Second Ballot Voting

Sept.27, 2011 Advanced Poll Kitscoty located at the Kitscoty Seniors Centre

Oct. 1, 2011 Election Day Poll Dewberry located at the Dewberry Seniors Centre

Hours for voting will be from 9:00 AM to 7:00 PM at all Polls.

Results of the vote will be available through the media later in the evening on both Election Days.

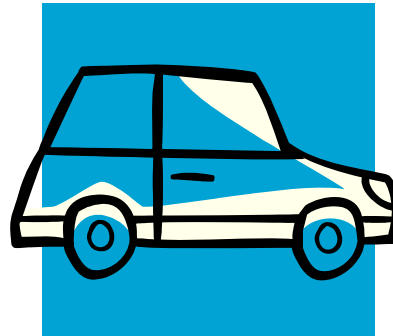


In Memoriam

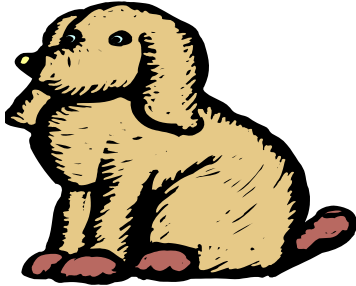

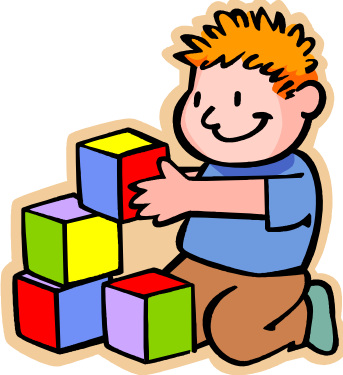
